- ✓ Record your thoughts as you read on sticky notes or in a journal (ask questions, make inferences, create connections, summarize chunks of text, etc)

Where to Find Great Books for Free?

The Dearborn Public Libraries offer a <u>free digital collection</u> with hundreds of books. Many of these books come with free audio and genres include adventure, mystery, sci-fi, historical fiction, graphic novels, etc. Or, use you library card number to access <u>Hoopla</u>, a wonderful collection of digital books, movies, audio books, music and more.

Access <u>SORA- Online Ebooks</u> for downloadable ebooks and audiobooks. Just select Dearborn Public Schools and use your district provided gmail account to login. Here you can search by genre and grade level for a wide variety of books to borrow. If you are new to SORA, <u>start here</u> with a guide to getting set up.

Try ReadMichigan for free digital books and poems by Michigan authors.

Looking for something shorter?

Accessing <u>CommonLit's summer reading texts</u> is easy. Just make sure you are logged into your student account on CommonLit.org or have your parent create an account (see link for details) and navigate to the High School section. Then, all you have to do is **click on the collection of the specially selected texts that you want to read and it will open on CommonLit.org.** When you return in the fall, your teacher can see your progress, and you can join in discussions about the articles you read!
