A Message from Our Principal Zeina Jebril...

Greetings Pioneers!

We've had a great first semester and I'm eager for the great things we have planned for 2025!

I have revived my PSAC-Principal Student Advisory Council - and we met in December. The goal of the PSAC is to provide leadership opportunities for 10th, 11th and 12th grade students with a focus on community service, social issues that impact their education, and overall school related concerns while allowing student voices to be heard. Another goal is to foster learning that develops student leaders who are empathetic, kind and compassionate. I recognize the importance of student leadership and will be working with students to make our school a kind, student friendly, and safe place to learn with student input and feedback.

With the start of second semester, I would like to stress the importance of monitoring your student's grades and attendance by getting a ParentConnect account and checking it frequently. If you need assistance with this, please call the office and we can get that set up for you. Teachers also use Schoology to post assignments that students can access from home. We offer FREE tutoring three times a week, so please encourage your students to take advantage of this when/if they need additional help.

As far as school news, I usually send a weekly email outlining school events and reminders. If you have not been receiving these emails, please call the office to update the email address we have on file for you. You can also subscribe to our school website at https://dhs.dearbornschools.org/ to receive emails that will help you stay up to date. As well, you will find a list of staff members that you can contact to help support your child.

We stress the importance of student attendance at DHS, please ensure that your child is in school everyday. Students missing 10 days or more, take the risk of losing credit in their class. If your child must miss a school day, please call the attendance line to report their absence. By the same token, if you need to have them leave early, call the attendance office and we will document and call them out for you. We ask that you refrain from calling your child's cell phone to call them out as we do have a strict cell phone policy that we enforce.

I strongly believe in partnership between home and school. It truly takes a village to educate and raise our children. My staff and I welcome you and your communication in any way that works for you. We have an open door policy and are always willing to engage in dialogue to help meet the needs of our students.

A message from the Math Department



SAT and PSAT Math: Know That You Can Do It!

It's really worth your time to improve your SAT score. Hour for hour, it's the best thing you can do to raise your chance of getting into the college or program that you want.

Your SAT score is a reflection of how hard you work and how well you study, not your IQ and not your school grades. Here's why: the SAT is an unusual test. When you take it, don't you get the sense that the questions are nothing like what you've seen in school? It's purposely designed this way. The SAT can't test difficult concepts, because this would be unfair for students who never took AP Calculus. The SAT is a national test, which means it needs a level playing field for all students around the country.

So it HAS to test concepts that all high school students will cover. Basic algebra (solving for x, manipulating equations), data analysis (mean, median, mode), advanced algebra (solving systems of equations, quadratic equations), and geometry (triangles, circles and lines.)

You've practiced all of this before during middle school and high school. But the SAT still has to make the test difficult, so it needs to test these concepts in strange ways. This trips up students who don't prepare, but it rewards students who understand the test well. To improve your score, you need to:

- Learn the types of questions that the SAT tests
- Put together the concepts you already know to solve the questions
- Practice on a lot of questions so you learn from your mistakes

Freshman - Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How do students sign-up to play sports? Contact the appropriate head coach. https://iblog.dearbornschools.org/dhsathletics1/athletics-home/

Q: Is a Health Appraisal form required for all freshmen? All students must submit a green "physical" form signed by their physician. Students involved in athletics are required to submit a white "sports" form.

Q: How can a parent regularly monitor student grades & attendance? Every parent and student will receive Parent/Student Connect passwords via email at the beginning of the school year. Middle school passwords carry over to the high school. Access begins 2 weeks into the school year.

Q: How many days of school can students miss and still earn credit for graduation? Students who miss more than 10 days (absences + tardies combined) may receive reduced credit. Extended vacations are strongly discouraged because students can possibly get reduced credit.

Q: How do students recover lost credit from a failing grade or excessive absences? ASAP (After School Academic Program) is offered every semester along with summer school. (There is a cost.)

Q: What should a student do if they experience a problem in a class? The student should start by having a private conversation with the teacher. If extra assistance is needed, parents and school support staff (counselor, social worker) will work with the student for a resolution.

Scholarship Opportunity!

During the 2006-2007 school year the Dearborn High School Parent Faculty Student Association (PFSA) established a scholarship fund to reward and recognize outstanding DHS Seniors as they pursue a higher education.

The number of and amount of each scholarship is determined by the PFSA annually based on the amount of funds available. It is subject to change each year. Recipients of the PFSA Scholarship will receive a check issued to the Accredited University/College of their choice.

For the 2024-2025 School Year the PFSA has approved four \$500 Scholarships.

PFSA Scholarship Application Submission Deadline is Friday, April 25, 2025.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Graduating Senior.
- Attended Dearborn High School a minimum of two years; Junior and Senior years.
- Attending an accredited college or university.
- Must be a U.S. Citizen or lawful permanent resident.
- Must have an overall GPA of 3.0 or greater.
- Must have had a PFSA membership a minimum of two years of which one is during their senior year.
 - Participation in PFSA sponsored meetings/events will be considered.

Criteria for Award of Funds:

Complete the <u>application</u>. The application must be submitted along with a letter of recommendation from a DHS teacher and a 150-200 word essay. The topic is "Words of wisdom to myself as an incoming freshman at Dearborn High School".

All Eligibility Requirements must be met to be eligible for the PFSA Scholarship. Final determination of the PFSA Scholarship is based on the results from the PFSA essay by the Selection Committees' decision from the eligible pool of applicants. The selection committee consists of the DHS Principal or designee, DHS Counselor and two members of the PFSA Executive Board. No member of the Selection Committee can be related by blood, marriage, adoption or guardianship to any of the applicants. Decisions by the Selection Committee will be final.
