Freshman - Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How do students sign-up to play sports?

Contact the appropriate head coach. [DHS Athletics](#)

Q: Is a Health Appraisal form required for all freshmen? All students must submit a green “physical” form signed by their physician. Students involved in athletics are required to submit a white “sports” form.

Q: How can a parent regularly monitor student grades & attendance? Every parent and student will receive Parent/Student Connect passwords via email at the beginning of the school year. Middle school passwords carry over to the high school. Access begins 2 weeks into the school year.

Q: How many days of school can students miss and still earn credit for graduation? Students who miss more than 10 days (absences + tardies combined) may receive reduced credit. Extended vacations are strongly discouraged because students can possibly get reduced credit.

Q: How do students recover lost credit from a failing grade or excessive absences? ASAP (After School Academic Program) is offered every semester along with summer school. (There is a cost.)

Q: What should a student do if they experience a problem in a class? The student should start by having a private conversation with the teacher. If extra assistance is needed, parents and school support staff (counselor, social worker) will work with the student for a resolution.

Final Forms Information

Dearborn High School Athletic Registration Information

Dearborn High School uses **FinalForms**, an online forms and data management service, for all athletic registration. FinalForms saves your student's data from season to season and year to year, so you never need to enter the same information twice.

Quick Guide: Dearborn High School Athletic Registration

All student-athletes must complete **FinalForms** registration and submit a valid sports physical before participating in tryouts, practices, or games.

Step 1: Collect Required Information

Have the following ready before starting online registration:

- Insurance provider name and policy number
- Doctor, dentist, and medical specialist contact details
- Preferred hospital information
- Basic medical and health history

Step 2: Complete Online Registration

Visit <https://dearborn-mi.finalforms.com/> to get started.

- **New Families:** Click **NEW ACCOUNT** under the Parent icon. Enter your name, date of birth, and email. Check your inbox to confirm your account and set a password. *(Check spam if not received in 2 minutes, or email support@finalforms.com).*
- **Returning Families:** Log in to your existing account to update student information for the new school year.

Step 2: Complete Online Registration (continued)

- **Add Student & Select Sports:** Click **ADD STUDENT**, enter their legal name, select the sport(s) they plan to play, and click **UPDATE**.
- **Sign Forms:** Complete each form, type your full name in the parent signature field, and click **SUBMIT FORM**.
- **Student Signatures:** Once parent sections are complete, an automated email goes to your student's school account for their required signatures.

Status Check: All sections must turn **GREEN**. A red or yellow status means incomplete signatures or forms, which prevents students from trying out.

Step 3: Submit Sports Physical

- **Requirement:** Must be completed and signed by an MD, DO, NP, or PA.

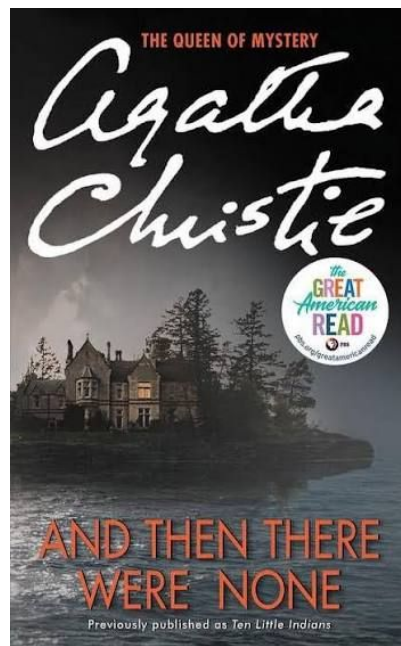
